Exploring Education Through Imaging

Geography with Photography Club

Sessions Overview

Through a series of entertaining and educational workshops, based on practical hands-on experiences, this course is designed to give an appreciation of how Geography shapes not only our world, but our view of it, through the medium of Photography/Imaging and for pupils to gain an insight into a range of related careers.

Breakdown of Sessions for the Geography with Photography Workshops:

Session 1: Workshop Introduction

Learning opportunities include:

- Discussing the different areas of Geography – Human, Physical, Geology, Geomorphology etc
- Introduction to photography skills - Composition
- Capturing images to represent each area of Geography

Session 2: Using Natural and Artificial Light

Learning opportunities include:

- Photography skills - Lighting
- Use of wide angle and zoom in photography
- Manipulating images (Photoshop or similar)

Session 3: Features of the Landscape

Learning opportunities include:

- Exploring our environment – why it looks the way it does
- Introduction to Landscape Photography
- Lighting for landscape, silhouettes
- Capturing and sharing landscape images

Session 4: How Water Shapes the Earth

Learning opportunities include:

- Exploring the effects of water through rivers and seas
- Photographing flowing water
- Following a water course – creating panoramas/photo-collages

Session 5: Exploring the Weather

Learning opportunities include:

- Photographing the sky, working with the sun
- Exploring cloud images – finding out about the different types
- Capturing creative images – eg through rain covered windows, using reflections etc.

Session 6: A Personal Exploration

Learning opportunities include:

- Practising the range of skills learned in the club
- Carrying out a personal project using one, some or all of the aspects of Geography, creating either a series of images or a photo-collage.
- Presenting their images to each other, explaining why they like them
- Keeping a photographic travel record.

Note: Pupils could prepare for session 6 by capturing a series of images at home.
