Breakdown of Sessions for the Aerospace Workshops:

Session 1: Introduction to Aerospace

Learning opportunities include:

- What is Aerospace?
- Looking at Aerospace in Science, Engineering and Business
- Careers in Aerospace

Session 2: History of Flight

Learning opportunities include:

- Early experiments to Moon landings
- Peace and War
- Our own experimental Rockets

Session 3: Biomimetics

Learning opportunities include:

- What is meant by Biomimetics and Reverse Engineering?
- How we use discoveries from Nature to help develop new products that help improve the quality of our lives
- Exploring flight – the study of how birds to enable human flight is one of the earliest examples of biomimicry
- Using examples of how Nature works to inform our own designs

Session 4: Structures

Learning opportunities include:

- What is a Structure?
- What is Triangulation?
- Working together to produce a structure based on those recorded from Nature
- Recording the process: Documentary Photography

Session 5: Aerospace Manufacturing

Learning opportunities include:

- Working together to produce quality products
- Designing and modelling our own planes in competition

Session 6: Bio-Engineering - Agriculture
