

Using photography and visual media in numeracy

Imaging Partnership offers a workshop series aimed at key stages 1 and 2 called 'Do the Maths'. The aim of this series is to help pupils understand photography and visual media in order to bring this topic to life in a fun and engaging way. Visual media is assessable to a wide range of pupils and allows them to express themselves at a level that suits their personal abilities.

Pupils will also be encouraged to develop their own ideas to produce a final piece of work. Imaging Partnership aims to encourage all positive behaviour and involvement within the workshops to achieve a higher standard of work, while also giving pupils one-on-one assistance where needed encouraging asking for help when it is required.

The series has been created to deliver 6 hours of contact time. This can be delivered in three two hourly sessions or over a whole day.

What our workshops cover

Patterns

Planning and photographing a dance sequence

Shapes

Using photography to identify shapes in nature

Handling Data

Creating a storyboard by collating visual data in a sequential way

Calculating

Producing a photographic weather forecast and calculating the possibility of sunshine and rain

Measuring

Creating a photographic collage by using different shapes and fitting them together

Summing Up

Putting together a summary of our projects and evaluating how you can make maths accessible in a visual way

Workshops can be tailored to suit ages from 5 to 11 and also for teachers as an INSET day. They are delivered by experienced photography professional practitioners. Pupils and teachers use their own or the school's cameras, iPads or tablet devices.
